

hirley's School of Dance was founded in 1955 by Shirley Hothem. With many dance studios to choose from, Shirley's School of Dance offers a family-oriented environment. In fact, every one of the studio's eight teachers danced at the studio during their childhood. And many of the current moms of dancers also danced at the studio.

Shirley's School of Dance offers dance classes for students ages three and up. Classes include ballet, lyrical, contemporary, pointe, acro, jazz, hip hop, and tap. The studio also has a competition team called Take the Stage Competition Team, competing around the state and at nationals every summer. Adult tap and ballet classes are also available.

"Shirley's School of Dance is a second home to our girls. It has given them many life skills while teaching them to be beautiful dancers," said Dewann Weltmer.

Many of the instructors have taught at the studio for more than 25 years and some are certified with Ohio Dance Masters, Dance Masters of America, and Acrobatic Arts. "We feel you need to find the studio you are comfortable with," said Terri Vasickanin, director of Shirley's School of Dance. "Once you do that you will feel at home and want to always stay there."

In 1986, Shirley retired and sold the studio to Janice Allen Wasosky. Janice was a student the first year the studio was opened and has attended every recital since. Due to an illness, Janice's daughter, Terri, took over running the studio.

Shirley's School of Dance is proud to be the original studio to hold its annual recital at the Palace Theatre in Canton. The first recital there was in 1981. Now many local studios hold their recitals there and Shirley's likes to think it was the trail blazer. One of the studio's favorite traditions is that it opens its recital with a Rockette style kick line. That tradition began with Shirley and has been passed down. The studio has also performed at Light up Downtown in Canton on the main stage for the past six years.



Lake Cable's Helping Hands

A compassionate community service group

rief is a universal human experience, and each person copes with it in their unique way. In times of loss, the support of friends and community can be a comforting presence. For Lake Cable Recreation Association members, a remarkable service called Helping Hands has been providing assistance to those in their time of need since April 2011. This heartwarming initiative was founded by Cindy Waikem and later taken over by Molly Romano in April 2021. Helping Hands offers a range of services to help families during wakes and funeral services.

The story of Helping Hands began when one of Cindy's friend's had a husband who had passed away, and they approached Cindy for guidance on arranging a wake. To their dismay, there were no existing organizations providing such support in the area. This realization deeply moved Cindy, prompting her to take action. She reached out to Debbie Spaner, and together, they scoured party supplies and gathered enough equipment to help her friend through this time and establish Helping Hands. Though there had been a previous group at Lake Cable that offered a similar service, it had disbanded over the years, leaving a void in the community's support network.

Helping Hands took an active approach from the start. They made sure that they had everything they needed for the wake. They set up tables and chairs and served food to the grieving families. A dedicated group of ladies cooked for the services. Their philosophy was simple: if they didn't have it, they would go out and buy it to ensure a well-organized and comforting environment for the families during these difficult times.

The core of Helping Hands is to ensure that the families don't need to worry about entertaining guests during such an emotionally challenging time. The service is entirely free, but most families choose to pay it forward by making donations to cover paper products, to-go containers, coffee pots, and other expenses. This generosity not only sustains the service but also keeps the sense of community strong.

Molly, who took over the reins of Helping Hands in April 2021, has continued to build on the legacy of compassion and community support. She coordinates with the families and reaches out to the Lake Cable Women's Club for assistance. Members of the Women's Club come together to bake desserts, set up, serve, and help with the cleanup. Helping

What makes Helping Hands so special is that it brings the Lake Cable community together. When people witness the support and compassion offered, they are moved to get involved and help out, just as one member did after experiencing their own loss. To Molly, it's not just a service; it's a support group. Losing a loved one is a devastating experience, and the emotional support and practical assistance provided by Helping Hands can be a lifeline during this time.

The service is offered exclusively to LCRA members, creating a strong sense of community

Molly funds Helping Hands personally, but the community has also rallied to support the cause. People donate old party supplies, coffee carafes, and water pitchers. The LCRA office staff and clubhouse management provide information to those in need of Helping Hands' services. Once they contact Molly, she helps them connect with a caterer, making the logistics of the event much easier for the grieving families. Helping Hands has also adapted to the changing times. While originally held only at the Lake Cable clubhouse, the service can now be accommodated at funeral homes or at Lake Cable, providing families with more flexibility and convenience.

The mission of Helping Hands is beautifully encapsulated in their statement: "We are a community service group of compassionate Lake Cable members willing to help the families of deceased LCRA members." It embodies the spirit of unity and support that has made Helping Hands an invaluable asset to the Lake Cable community.




